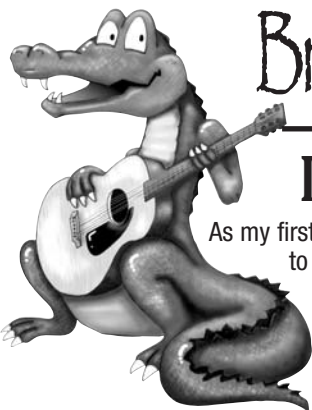


LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT... (May 2009)

With a new job promotion (congrats, Nancy!), she may be busy with other things, but I suspect we'll still be seeing her around. Dave Cambest coordinated CD sales at the Round Up, helped with the sound system at our open mics, and brought his folk community networking skills to the Board. While he is stepping down for now, he will continue to be visible in the community via his outstanding house concert series. Neil Leibowitz, our past Treasurer, helped us get much needed grant money, and kept us on financially solid ground. Rumor has it that he is fulfilling his lifelong dream of riding the subways of NY. Let's just hope that, unlike Charlie and the MTA, Neil DOES return someday.

Next, I wanted to thank those Board members who will continue to serve for another year: Jamie Saccullo, who has done a terrific job with MySpace, will now take on the additional duties of Treasurer. Janis Rubel will continue to coordinate our song swaps and open mics, and will continue to serve as our Membership Chair. And Bob Singer, our webmaster, will now be serving as Vice President. Bob has been an invaluable resource to me, bringing his wealth of experience as past President, offering advice and friendship, and always being there to lend a hand and provide support as I faced new challenges.

Finally, I wanted to welcome our incoming Board members: Bruce Feldman, a past Board member, will be returning to serve as our Secretary. Carrie Lynn Kaplan, another past Board member, will be serving as our Parliamentarian. You're also likely to see Carrie at our monthly open mics, helping out with sound or serving as Emcee. And finally, Walter Morris will be joining the Board for the first time. While he may be the "newcomer," we all learned firsthand what a wonderful resource we have in Walter. He was our Stage Manager and Marketing Coordinator at the Round Up, and will be serving in the capacity of Marketing Chair.

Although I admit there were times when I wasn't sure exactly where we were headed or how we would get there, in retrospect I am immensely proud of what we as a Club have accomplished together this past year. Looking back, there was the terrific Zoe Lewis concert and the Folk Round Up, with its wonderful array of music. We found a "home" for our open mic series, which is thriving and will continue to do so at the Fresh Aroma Coffee Bar in Deerfield Beach. We now have two well attended song swaps each month, one held in a member's home, and the other ("Jam in the Park") at Secret Woods Nature Center. We have a presence on both MySpace and Facebook. We've restructured our membership year to make keeping track of renewals easier. And just this past month, we've been involved in four outstanding events: We paid tribute to our folk mentor, Vic Heyman, at a wonderful concert in his memory; we helped raise money for the American Cancer Society by singing our hearts out at their Relay for Life (and had fun doing it!); we picnicked and sang together at our Annual Picnic (photos will soon be available on the website); and most recently we participated in a wonderful tribute concert in honor of Pete Seeger's 90th birthday.

If this past year is any indication, then there will be great things ahead. Our new Board will meet for the first time on Tuesday evening, May 5th, when we will begin to map out our plans for the coming year. All are welcome to attend. While summer is traditionally a quieter, slower season, there will still be music. Our song swaps will continue throughout the summer, as will our "Open Mic with Featured Performer" series. (We've got a great summer line-up. Check out the "Summer Series" schedule listed later in this newsletter.) And... as our new membership year begins on October 1st, the end of the summer will mark the beginning of our membership drive. We welcome you all to stay involved, and we hope to see you around.

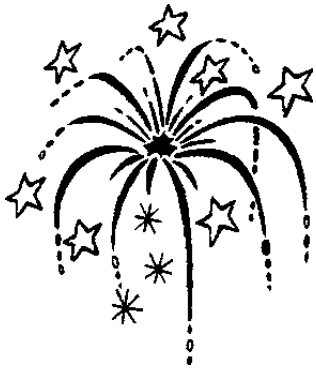

Dear folk members and music lovers,

First of all, my apologies for the many messages back and forth, many of them by mistake and my appreciation to all those who contributed to Relay For Life. Many of us now captured the concept of RFL and this is worth mentioning. Many contributed much more than the minimum. Somebody made a generous contribution in memory of Danny Aaronson. Contributions are still coming in and Arlene will also provide details.

We had some minor showers but overall it was nice weather, when we came in we were greeted by a site number change but we were still away from the main stage to do our singing. At our tent we had a song circle and we practiced for our stage performance.

At about 10 PM all the lights went out. Reverent silence and darkness took over; the luminarias were lit. We heard the sound of bagpipes playing "Amazing Grace" and we remembered those club members who have survived cancer and those who have left us.

For the stage practice, the idea I had of a choir following a director and my list of songs quickly got scrapped and instead we came up with a list of songs that one of us at a time would lead and in effect we would have a song-circle. Talk about teamwork and quick results! We mobbed the stage but we had Marshall, from Dade (I may be misspelling his name) who was proudly displaying a very, very purple survivor's shirt. We were about ten strong; about six guitars and one or two harmonicas. They had only one mic and it was not even on a stand but we never lost hope, not even for a second, though idea about the lemonade came to my mind. It even started raining but our luck quickly changed for the better thanks to the energy each one of us brought in. We started sounding better and better.

They loved us; Liz Gassew, the event coordinator came up for a quick announcement but I could tell by the shaken tone of her voice that she was very impressed, happy and even feeling lucky to have found us. I went out to listen to the overall sound and it was wonderful; the occasional harmonica brought out that 'festival sound' we like so much. Three very young boys came up to stage on their own and we even had time to let one of them play. I told you this event is casual!!!

That stage performance saved our night. After so much motivation we gathered, we got back to our place for our own music that walkers passing by could hear. This time most of the noise was gone and we stayed up way past 4AM. After the music a few remaining souls slept in tents or just under the canopy. A few drops of rain woke up with the new morning but we could still hear walkers passing by. We had more music when Rusty Rock came in and we had some kind of workshop about singing and guitars; the three stage boys also came back to see us again and play. Donald attended the boys and he explained about folk music, guitars and wind instruments, something I also need to hear.

A final lap with everybody on the track concluded the event. One final note of appreciation to those who contributed and helped with this event. Janis, the first person I spoke to about this RFL event, Arlene for her unconditional support, Donald who helped me on these last two days from the beginning to the end who never stopped singing and his fingers never got tired of playing; also Joe Virga, Bill Jeffers and all those who came in from other counties, Ellen Bukstel who provided canopies and everything else we needed.
