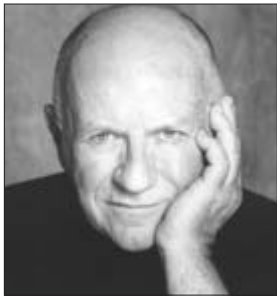

SingOut! Magazine calls Michael "one of the few undisputed geniuses among singer-songwriters today." He has been writing for over three decades, and songs such as "The Dutchman," "Spoon River," "Dead Egyptian Blues," "Last Days of Pompeii," and "I Brought My Father With Me" are just some of his better known



songs. Many people have been introduced to Michael's music from the recordings of his songs by artists such as Anne Hills, Bernice Lewis, Tom Rush, the late Steve Goodman, Claudia Schmidt, Jerry Jeff Walker, Liam Clancy, Gordon Bok, and even Jimmy Buffett. He has been featured on All Things Considered, Good Evening, and other National Public Radio programs, and on CBC Radio in Canada.

Bill Isles returned to performing after a twenty-five year hiatus in February of 2000. Since that time, he has become one of the most highly-respected singer/songwriters in the Minnesota acoustic scene and has begun to get national and international attention. Kate Isles was a closet singer/songwriter when she came to a CD release concert for Bill's first CD. She bought the CD and signed up on his e-mail list. Their relationship began soon afterwards with afternoon sessions with guitars, harmonies and coffee. They've been together ever since, marrying in May of 2004. Kate is becoming an integral part of the act. Their upcoming duet album, "Matching Baggage," will include several songs that they've co-written.
