SUBJ: Woody Guthrie on film?

There have been several films of one kind or another on the topic of Woody Guthrie, including one on PBS a couple of years ago (I have a copy).

But, very little actual footage of Woody Guthrie exists. A few years ago, I attended an event in DC which celebrated Guthrie's art work. There was a showing of all the video material of Woody that his daughter Nora (head of the Woody Guthrie Foundation and Archive in NY) was able to gather. It lasted about 15 minutes. Woody appeared in three small independent films in the 1940s--for a minute or so in each one. The Guthrie family has a private collection which includes about 10 minutes of home movies of Woody during his final years in decline.

The only clip that seems to have gotten around is one with Woody, Sonny Terry, and Brownie McGhee singing "John Henry." You may have seen that in the recent Pete Seeger or Bob Dylan documentaries.
