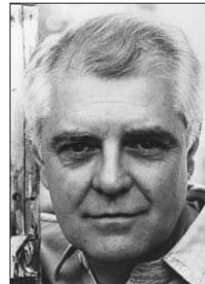

Great scene last night at the Folk Club of South Florida's Acoustic Underground show at the increasingly legendary Luna Star Cafe. Now that the New York Times has discovered Alexis' unique creation, the best kept secret in South Florida might be coming into its own light.

And Annie Wenz helped grow the story. A loving and warm standing room only audience, filled with many folk aficionados, was treated to music and stories of lovely communal evenings on the beaches of Thialand, adventures and experiences of crotch rocket jockeys and jam sessions with musicians in Pakistan. Annie's music on her native double American Indian flute was beautiful and haunting. And she accompanied herself on guitar and the real live who-knows-from-where house piano. All with great energy and, on any one else, tongue tripping delivery. There's only one Annie. With back up on many songs by Zip Robinson, Valerie C. Wisecracker and Amy Carol Webb, the evening was full of rich recording studio level sounds.

And the evening just would not quit. The stage saw Emma's revolution, Grant Peeples, Robert Baldwin and Mathew Sabatella before Annie did her final song and took her well earned bows. Thanks Annie.

Just in from another magic evening at the Shack in the Back, where the music once again brought us all together. We stayed after the show to gather 'round the campfire and sing. Led by Joe Virga, Ellen, Jack Hardy and David Massengill, the world around us seemed so far away, as we relished the serenity of the moment and the talents of the aforementioned. Earlier Shauna Sweeney opened the concert and took her place on a stage that has featured performers from all over the nation. She is playing regularly around the 3 counties and hosting a weekly open mic in Broward.

Jack Hardy and Dave Massengill have recently joined as the 'Folk Brothers' and are on a tour for several months. Both have distinguished solo careers and are two exceptionally literate writers. They elevate the genre with prose and poetry that stands on its own, with or without the enduring melodies they have composed. Complimenting each other as if they have played together for decades, their timing and harmonies are seamless. Their songs make you think and their respect for the listener is obvious. From love ballads to satire and political commentary, we were treated to the talent of masters. Thank you Ellen and Brian. Brett, the sound was delicious.

Saturday evening, Susan Moss and all the devoted helpers worked particularly hard to host a terrific performance by John McCutcheon at the UU Church in Ft. Lauderdale. I have heard John McCutcheon's music for years and experienced his opening address at Folk Alliance a few years ago. He talent, wit, and intellect always commanded my respect. But, I must confess, sitting three rows from the stage provided a vantage point on this remarkable individual. From his opening banjo and narrative on Bascar Lamar Lunsford, McCutcheon captivated us. He is a skilled and consummate musician, playing banjo, guitar, hammer dulcimer, autoharp, piano, unaccompanied vocal, and spoken word. His stage presence combines charisma with a natural, folksy style. He impresses as a very real, sincere, humorous, and outspoken fellow.

He had the audience singing along with him, in a Pete Seeger kind of way. As I have noticed over the years, it is usually the performer and not the song itself that evokes the audience's participation. I have seen very few artists, other than Pete, elicit such an immediate and overwhelming sing-along. Many try to get audiences to sing along, but few succeed. John McCutcheon succeeded, in every sense of the word. Although I attended the concert more out of a desire to see so many people from our folk community whom I have not seen in a while, I came away grateful to Susan Moss and the Labyrinth elves for the privilege of sharing this evening with such a remarkable person as John McCutcheon.
